RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Juniors must be in high school and not exceed 18 years of age.
2. Exhibitor fee is \$2.00. Each Exhibitor may show no more than one entry per section.
3. Anything to be shown in the palace must be in by 12:30 p.m. on Friday or be locked out.
4. No article may be removed from the grounds before 3:30 p.m. on Sunday.
5. Do not wash or peel vegetables; brush off loose dirt and display on disposable plates.
6. Juniors who wish to enter in Adult Classes must pay the Adult Exhibitor fee as well.
7. **Prize money may be picked up at Secretary booth on Saturday afternoon or Sunday.**

Chocolate Chip Cookies Competition Rules (no nuts)

1. Contest is open to youth up to 15 years (as of December 31 of current year).
2. Winner of the Chocolate Chip Cookies Class at the local Fair/Exhibition is eligible to enter the District Competition.
3. One entry per Agricultural Society.
4. Must be solely made by class winner.

District Competition

5. The winner from each Fair/Exhibition will be eligible to enter at the District Competition.
6. District entry must consist of 6 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name & address using the entry tag provided.
7. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, must be no larger than 2.5" (6.5 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm)
8. Prize money to be paid by the District.
9. If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter one district competition.

Provincial Competition

10. The entrant must be the winner from the District Competition
11. In cases where the district winner is unable to send an entry to the convention, then the 2nd place District winner will be eligible to enter.
12. The entry for the District must consist of 6 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, address & District represented using the entry tag provided.
13. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, are to be no larger than 2.5" (6.5 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5cm).
14. The entry must be tagged with the exhibitor's name, address and District represented using the entry tag provided.
15. Cookies will be judged according to the OAAS Homecraft Judging Standards.
16. Entries will be received at the Convention according to the convention schedule. Judging will commence at 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.

Provincial Poster Competition Rules

1. Winner of the Poster Competition class at the local Fair/Exhibition is eligible to enter the District Competition. District winners are eligible to enter at the provincial competition.
2. One entry per class per Agricultural Society.
3. Must be hand drawn.
4. Theme: "Promoting Your Fair" Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster
5. Poster Size (without border) : Minimum - 22 cm x 28 cm
Maximum - 28 cm x 44 cm
6. Three classes: A) Junior, up to and including grade 4
B) Intermediate, grade 5 to grade 8 inclusive
C) Senior, grade 9 to grade 12 inclusive
7. Each entry must be centered on **CARD STOCK** or **BRISTOL BOARD** exposing a 5.5 cm border on all four sides.
8. Limited to ONE entry per class per DISTRICT. Each district to hold a competition prior to the annual convention.
9. Name of fair, district no., contact person, owner of poster and complete mailing address must be clearly labelled on the back of each entry.
10. Entries will be delivered to the convention as posted, as required.

Note: Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies will not be responsible for lost items.
